Course Requirements

All applications will be considered individually. However, offers will usually be to those with at least one of the following qualifications:

? Foundation Degree in Early Childhood Studies

? Foundation Degree in Early Years Practice

? Foundation Degree in Working with Children and Young People

? Foundation degree in a relevant discipline or 240 credits in health or social care related studies

Your existing qualifications will be assessed to confirm comparability and suitability for entry to this course.

If English is not your first language you will need an IELTS score of 6.5 with a minimum of 5.5 in all skills, or a recognised equivalent. If your level of English language is currently below IELTS 6.5 we recommend you consider an appropriate Sheffield Hallam University Pre-sessional English course which will enable you to achieve the required level of English.

Course Assessment

A range of assessment methods are used, including reports, essays, presentations and portfolios. The assessments have been carefully designed to support and develop your skills in independent critical thinking and learning.
