Level 3, Apprenticeship Framework

Construction is a multi-billion pound industry that deals with developing the underlying structure of anything from maintenance and development of domestic properties to large commercial developments.

Almost two million people are employed in the UK Construction industry with a diverse range of skills. Apprenticeships are well recognised and valued as an entry route into the industry. Apprentices with the determination and willingness to work hard will find plenty of scope to move up the career ladder. Advanced Apprentice Bench Joiners will already be qualified at Level 2 and will be looking to develop their skills further take on more responsibility for organising, planning and pricing work improving quality and speed of work and by demonstrating to employers their commitment to the industry. They will learn how to manufacture bespoke and routine architectural joinery products, learning to mark out from setting out details, and to produce setting out details for routine joinery products. Apprentices will receive training at college one day a week, learning practical skills in our workshops and developing underpinning knowledge. We also support all our apprentices to achieve maths and English where required. The rest of the week is spent in the workplace gaining invaluable experience on the job.

Functional Skills	Functional Skills will be required for English and maths at Level 2 if you have not already attained an equivalent qualification.
Assessment	Workplace assessments are carried out once every 4-6 weeks, observing practice in the workplace, gathering evidence of competency and working with the employer to ensure skills are developing on the job.
