ELIGIBILITY/ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 5 GCSE's grades 3-9 including maths and English or equivalent.
- Level 2 NVQ Diploma Wood Occupations.

Construction is a multi-billion pound industry that deals with developing the underlying structure of anything from maintenance and development of domestic properties to large commercial developments.

Almost two million people are employed in the UK Construction industry with a diverse range of skills. Apprenticeships are well recognised and valued as an entry route into the industry. Apprentices with the determination and willingness to work hard will find plenty of scope to move up the career ladder. Advanced Apprentice Site Joiners must already be qualified at level 2 and are looking to develop their skills further, improving quality and speed of work on site and demonstrating to employers their commitment to the industry. They will learn how to organise, plan and price work, and to carry out first and second fix flooring, roofing, double doors and mouldings. Apprentices will receive training at college one day a week learning practical skills in our workshops and developing the underpinning knowledge required. We also support all our Apprentices to achieve Maths and English where required. The rest of the week is spent in the workplace gaining invaluable experience on the job.

APPRENTICESHIP REQUIREMENTS

NVQ Diploma level 3 and Diploma level 3 in Wood Occupations - Site Carpentry, Functional Skills Maths and English level 2, Employment Rights and Responsibilities and Personal Learning and Thinking Skills.

Functional Skills	Functional Skills will be required for English and Maths at level 2 if you have not already attained an equivalent qualification.
